The program will include an eclectic recital of music from the German Baroque (Bach, Buxtehude, Walther and Weckmann), the German Romantic (Herzogenberg), and some contemporary preludes on familiar hymns.

Also on May 1 at 4:00 P.M. closer to home in Staunton, Jamison McCarty and several of his organ classmates will perform evening vespers as their spring recital. The worship service takes place at Emmanuel Episcopal Church on Frederick Street and is open to the congregation.

They will present a staged reading of "Caesar and Pompey" by George Chapman, another Renaissance playwright. The play is described as a prelude to Shakespeare's "Julius Caesar."

Finally, at Lee Auditorium at 7:00 P.M., the Shelburne Middle School Concert Band performs with members Jackson Kiger and Rhiannon Wiseman as part of the ensemble.

And don't forget May 15 when the Staunton Choral Society returns to Christ Lutheran for their Spring Concert. The concert begins at 7:00 P.M. Rick Whitmore continues as president of the Choral Society.

#### Dear Friends

On Wednesday April 21, the church council met with Jeffrey Spann, Building Consultant with the ELCA Mission Investment Fund. Together, we walked through the building space to hear his insight and to discuss concerns already identified by the congregation and the council.

The downstairs, of course, stands in great shape. Mr. Spann talked well of our kitchen space, noting "people can work on both sides without bumping into each other." We discussed the need for storage near the fellowship hall and a handicapped accessible restroom near the classroom space. The downstairs space is clean, crisp and functional.

Naturally because of the importance of the sanctuary, the council and Mr. Spann had a substantial conversation about this space. We identified concerns about sound, lighting, and accessibility. We also expressed a desire for the space to feel less empty on Sunday mornings. Mr. Spann told us that when a visitor sees a worship space at less than 50% capacity, it feels empty to them and they wonder what the problem is. While our average worship attendance of 74 is typical for a congregation, it places us at 23% of our capacity. Moving forward, Mr. Spann suggested one committee who looks at how to enhance the sanctuary space for current and future worship.


Also, he suggested a second committee could look at the rest of the facility. When considering spaces throughout the facility, the committee would identify the primary and secondary purpose of each space and room. The council identified the church lounge as the most used space in the church (other than the sanctuary). Mr. Spann suggested that was because of the furnishings and decor. It was furnished both for board meetings as well as the casual seating arrangement in the second half of the room. Furnishing other rooms for their primary purpose could encourage their use.

The Mission Investment Fund provided this consulting time to us at no cost or obligation. The council will discuss what next steps the congregation might want to take and how to bring other members into the conversation.


